Abstract: According to existing theories of dispossession, we would expect squatters to be evicted when they occupy more valuable land, or when their occupation is more visible to passersby, or at the very least, when they are members of a more stigmatized racial group. But in my ethnography of two land occupations in post-apartheid Cape Town, none of these explanations holds. As an alternative, I trace processes of political organization in both settlements, demonstrating how the consolidation of a representational body in one led judges to grant residents the right to stay put; but in the other, where factionalism prevailed, judges viewed the occupiers as opportunists and ordered their eviction. Thus understanding urban change requires us to think political processes from above and below as inextricably intertwined. This dissertation brings tools from political sociology to bear upon urban sociological questions, developing an ethnographically informed theory of the post-apartheid state in the process.
