



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & BUSINESS

Students may elect to extend their program and earn 6 to 9 course credits by pursuing one of three different options. All tracks offer additional co-curricular activities to supplement cultural learning.

Option 1: Spanish Language and Community Engagement in Pamplona (3+3 credits)

Help the community and earn credit by adding the five week course Community Engagement in Pamplona beginning from May 18th and ending June 19th. The first two weeks students will have class full time in the mornings and service learning some evenings. The following three weeks students will have class and service learning some afternoons.

Language Prerequisite: at least two semesters of Spanish.

Option 2: Spanish Language and Business (3+3 credits)

Inmerge into local business by adding the two week course The Business of Wine and Gastronomy in Northern Spain (course taught in English) beginning from June 22nd and ending July 3rd. Classes will be taught in the mornings with field studies and co-curricular activities in the afternoons and evenings.

Language Prerequisite: none.

Option 3: Spanish Language, Community Engagement in Pamplona, and Business (3+3+3 credits)

Combine options 1 and 2 to create a well-rounded 7 week experience from May 18th to July 3rd.

Language Prerequisite: at least two semesters of Spanish.

UNIVERSIDAD DE NAVARRA

The Universidad de Navarra is a nonprofit private Catholic university founded in 1952. The university is made up of 4 campuses in Spain: Pamplona, San Sebastián, Madrid, and Barcelona. The University offers 38 degrees, 42 official masters, and 20 doctoral programs.

The Universidad de Navarra is 1st in Spain in the employability ranking QS 2019, 3rd in Europe in TIMES European Teaching ranking 2019, and best private university in the country. It is home to some of the most competitive graduate business programs available in the world.



PAMPLONA

Navarre is the Spanish region with the most varied landscapes and mild weather year round. Founded by the Romans and crossed by the Santiago Way, Pamplona is globally known as the headquarters of the international San Fermin festivities. The festival was brought to literary fame in 1926 with Ernest Hemingway's novel The Sun Also Rises

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

We offer a unique sociocultural program that help students improve their interpersonal oral and written communicative abilities in just 3-7 weeks. Students also develop critical thinking and creative skills through a digital storytelling final project.

SPANISH LANGUAGE AND CULTURE

All students will take a Spanish Written and Oral Communication Course, for a total of 3 credits, four class hours per day Monday to Friday for 3 weeks (60 class hours). Students will be placed in beginning, intermediate, or advanced level courses. Syllabi are available for transferring credits to home institutions. Our programs are taught by outstanding local professors from the Universidad de Navarra and by distinguished invited professors from other universities such as Columbia University, Dartmouth College, Barnard College, Scranton University, and Fairfield University.

Possibility of taking an official **Spanish Certification Exam** upon completion of program.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Weekly co-curricular activities to enrich cultural immersion in Spain and to better understand the culture in the context of coursework. Students will have the opportunity to visit many influential sites, learn about the country's unique history, and become immersed in Spanish culture. The following trips and activities in and around Pamplona are led by Cultural Peer Mentors and are included in the program fee:

- Day trip to Bilbao and Guggenheim Museum
- Day Trip to San Sebastián
- Excursion to Olite Castle
- Pilgrimage along the Camino de Santiago
- Pamplona Old Town
- Cathedral of Santa Maria la Real
- "Running of the Bulls" walk
- Rumba Flamenca workshop
- Kayaking
- Juevintxo



HOUSING

Students may arrange their own housing or choose between the two options provided by the program:

Host Family: All families are Universidad de Navarra faculty, staff, or alumni. Students have their own room. Laundry and meals included. Lunch served from Monday to Friday at the university cafeteria. WIFI internet is available in all houses. Public transport card is included in this option. Host Families are limited. Applying earlier increases likelihood of being placed with a family.

Residence Hall: Camplus is a residence hall located right in the heart of Pamplona and just a 25 minute walk or short bus ride away from the University. Housing fee includes individual room with private bathroom and meals during the program.
